




Introduction

Hasle Marina is located in a large harbour with active commercial fishing, and it is safe to approach day and night, in all weather conditions. There is always plenty of space for guest sailors in the harbour, and you are well-protected in bad weather. Hasle offers good shopping opportunities and restaurants, including the new lifestyle café at the harbour and the fascinating museum smokehouse just south of the harbour.

In the town, you will also find the cultural center 'Grønbechs Gård', which has a large exhibition of Bornholm's arts and crafts. The harbour features a harbour bath with a diving tower, and south of the harbour, there are lovely sandy beaches. South of the harbour, there are also large forest areas with clay and coal pits, where the fascinating cultural history of Hasle tiles is shared. North of the harbour, the rocky coast of Bornholm begins. The Port of Hasle has become a kayaking hotspot where it is possible to hire and/learn to paddle a kayak. There is also a brand-new maritime museum named "Columbus" where the canal meets the harbour. Old ship engines are started up every day during peak season at the museum.



Introduction

Visby traces its roots back to a Viking settlement and trade was an important activity from the outset helped by access to fresh water and a natural harbour. Gotland's excellent geographical location meant that the Vikings thrived and used it as a base to venture eastwards establishing connections as far as the Black Sea and Constantinople. A large number of silver treasures and Arabic coins have been found, and art in churches and on rune stones shows Byzantine influence.

Gotland had an independent status both from Sweden and Denmark long into the medieval period. In the twelfth and thirteenth century Visby's status as a trading town grew and this was also the time when the work on the circular town wall commenced, and the old wooden houses were replaced with stone buildings. The wall is still intact and is unique in the Scandinavian countries. In the eleventh and twelfth century Gotland and Visbyrose to play a dominant role in the Baltic trade linking Western Europe with Russia. Visby became the main centre for the Hanseatic League in the Baltic and the commercial routes were channelled through the city. However, in the fourteenth century a number of disasters struck Visby. The Plague arrived in 1350, then in 1361 the Danish King Valdemar IV attacked the city and tore down part of the wall. Around 2000 people were killed in the battle and Valdemar set up three huge beer barrels and threatened to destroy the town unless they were filled with gold and silver. The city complied and the churches were stripped of their valuables.

The turbulent times continued with a succession of different rulers and at times the city even became the base for pirates. It was not until 1645 with the treaty between Denmark and Sweden at Brömsebro that Gotland finally became Swedish. At that time the city had lost its strategic trade position and remained relatively underdeveloped. Today, however, Visby and Gotland is one of Sweden's most liked holiday destinations.

Approach

After having crossed the South Baltic, boats will find the Swedish island of Gotland on their starboard side. Approaching Gotland yachts will discover two small islands Stora Karlsö and Lilla Karlsö approximate 20 miles before arriving in the port of Visby. The islands are a nature reserve, home to the biggest bird mountain in the Baltic – 'Stora Karlsö'. There is a yearly drama when, in the beginning of July, newly hatched guillemot chicks jump from the high cliffs down to the sea following their parents.

There is easy entrance and access to the marina that is centrally located in the port of Visby. It is a full service marina and a very popular goal for Swedish mainland sailors, always crowded in the summer. The marina is in close proximity to the main sights such as the city wall, medieval city centre and the museum. In addition, Visby offers a number of restaurants and a rich night life, in particular for the younger generation.



Introduction

The Gotska Sandön (Gotlandic Sand Island) is one of Sweden's national parks approximately 5nm long and 3nm wide. It is situated some 20nm North of Gotland and is composed of dunes, beaches and pine forests. The island has no year round inhabitants but in summer time there is a small youth hostel operating close to the lighthouse on the North Western point (Bredsand).

Arrival Information

There is no port nor is it possible to get provisions on the island. With the prevailing south-westerly winds the recommended anchorage is on the northern side under the light house in approximate position 58°23'.9N 19°12'.0E. Anchor close to the 5 meter contour in sand.

Pets are not allowed to be brought ashore.

A Brief History of Gotska Sandön

Over the centuries the island has been inhabited mostly as a basis for fishermen and seal hunters, but there has also been sheep on the island, and in the nineteenth century a farm was established. At some point even a shipyard operated on the island. In the mid-nineteenth century the island was acquired by the state and the construction of lighthouses commenced (1859). Close to the Bredsand lighthouse a small village developed including the home for the lighthouse keeper and a school for his children. Today the school is a small museum. A short distance from the village is a small chapel surrounded by a beautiful deciduous forest.

The Legend of Peter Gottberg

One of the most famous inhabitants of the island was Peter Gottberg. He rented the island, but according to legend, he was also a murderer, pirate and a beachcomber. He was born 1762 and it is believed he was coerced into piracy as a young man. In 1801 he rented the island and moved there with his family. It is believed he lured ships to wreck on the island and that he later killed their crew in his barn. The end came in 1814 when he tried to sell cargo from a stranded ship (the jakt Cerberus af Greifswald) in Stockholm and part of the cargo, a wolf skin fur coat, was recognised. He served 28 days in prison on water and bread. The light sentence was due to the fact murder could not be proved. He and his wife are buried in the Boo cemetery close to Saltsjöbaden.

Introduction

Tallinn is also known as Reval, a name that it acquired in the thirteen century and kept until 1918 when Estonia first became an independent country. The early ruler of Reval (Tallinn) was Denmark, which founded the city in 1219. Subsequently it was sold to the Teutonic Knights in 1346 and later ceded to Sweden in 1582. Since medieval time, German influence has been strong (Tallinn entered the Hanseatic league in 1285) and until the twentieth century, regardless of what country ruled, the ruling class was German speaking. During the Swedish period the country prospered with a university established in Dorpat (Tartu) in 1632. Following the Great Northern War Sweden lost Estonia to Russia and it remained Russian until 1918 when Estonia declared independence and Tallinn became its capital. During World War II Estonia was annexed by the USSR in 1940 and later occupied by Germany from 1941 until 1944. Between 1944 and 1991 it was again annexed by the USSR but in August 1991 an independent democratic Estonian state was re-established.



Since independence the country has embarked on a very ambitious development strategy aiming at raising the standard of living in par with other European countries. Estonia became a member of the European Union and NATO in 2004 and signed the Schengen treaty in 2007. Now, Estonia is benefitting from EU regional support to improve infrastructure and a major part of foreign investment comes from Sweden. Nowadays it is globally recognised as a premier startup hub.

The main sights in Tallinn include the Old Town (Hanseatic), city walls and defences, the St. Olaf's Church (15th century) and the Gothic town hall. Other attractions worth visiting include the recently opened Seaplane Maritime Museum, Open Air Museum and the Olympic TV Tower.



Introduction

Finland has followed on a path of fast economic development and industrialisation since the mid twentieth century. Today, the Finnish educational system is considered to be one of the best in Europe; its industry is highly competitive; it is credited to be one of the least corrupt countries in the world and, the quality of life in Finland has repeatedly been assessed as one of the highest in the world. Swedish and Finnish are official languages however the number of Swedish speaking inhabitants has decreased from around 20 % in the nineteenth century to around 5% today.

Helsinki

Helsinki (in Swedish Helsingfors) was established in 1550 as a rival to Reval (Tallinn). The Plague in 1710 killed a major part of the inhabitants and it was not until Finland became the autonomous Grand Duchy in 1809 as it developed into a substantial city.

Main sights include the Helsinki Cathedral (constructed 1830-1852) and the Suomenlinna fort (Sveaborg). Suomenlinna is a UNESCO World Heritage site and, in addition to the fortress itself, it hosts a number of museums and a Nordic Arts Centre.



Introduction

Mariehamn, "the town of the thousands Linden trees", has a picturesque town centre and is a major port. It is an important international harbour linking Sweden and Finland with daily ferry traffic. The ferry traffic is bolstered by the fact that Åland is not part of the EU customs zone and thus tax free goods can be purchased onboard. Åland's unique status is due to the legal basis in that Åland is an autonomous territory under Finnish sovereignty. Mariehamn, the capital, with 11,000 inhabitants, is the seat of the Government and the Parliament. Åland and Mariehamn are Swedish speaking and a large majority speak it as their native language. Mariehamn was founded in 1861 and named after the Empress consort Maria Alexandrovna of Tsar Alexander II.

Gustaf Eriksson

Gustaf Eriksson was a ship-owner from Mariehamn and became famous for his cargo shipping line that consisted of square riggers. Following the end of World War I, the days of sailing ships were considered to be over but Erikson saw the opportunity to do the exact opposite. He realised that big sailing ships in good condition would be available at low prices, so he bought many windjammers and assigned his big ships on the Australian wheat trade route where they could compete successfully with steamers.

However, World War II put an end to the era of large sailing ships and the few remaining square riggers still afloat are now restaurants or museum ships.


